Language of Instruction

The general language of instruction is **German**. The **minimum** language requirement for exchange students is **level B1** according to the CEFR.

The first week of October is the Welcome Week for all new students at Babelsberg, including exchange students.

In the summer semester the International Office organizes a Welcome Day for all new exchange students at the beginning of April.

Tuition Fees

The Film University does not ask for tuition fees. However, there is an administrative contribution for public transport, equipment insurance and Student Services that cannot be waived. Currently, the contribution is ca. **270€ per semester for exchange students**.

Arrival Date

Students are required to arrive on the first day of the lecture period at the latest. Any later arrival is not recommended and should be agreed upon with the International Office in advance.

Nomination

Incoming exchange students need to be nominated by their home institution via email by the above mentioned dates to internationaloffice@filmuniversitaet.de

Application Procedure

Exchange students need to hand in their application for an exchange semester to the International Office at the Film University Babelsberg by email. Students need to make a choice for a specific program they wish to join. Applications are reviewed by the professors of the respective study program students are applying for. Nomination from the partner university does not guarantee acceptance to the university!

Documents needed:

- Filled in [application form](#).
- CV

- Transcript of Records
- Letter of recommendation from a professor of your home institution
- Letter of Motivation **specifically written for Film University**
- Proof of your [German language skills](#) (the OLS assessment is not sufficient proof)
- Portfolio (to be reviewed by the respective study program advisor)

All documents must either be in German or English! Own translations are accepted if they include a confirmation of the home university.

Application deadlines: May 15 for winter term/Nov 15 for summer term

The Film University provides [state-of-the-art technology](#) covering every aspect of moving image production. The university's equipment room houses camera, sound, lighting, VR, and AR gear established on the market and used by industry professionals.

Courses & Online Learning Agreement

The **Online Learning Agreement** needs to be agreed upon with the respective institutional coordinator before the start of the semester. The Film University uses the **Online Learning Agreement** from the EU in order to digitalize and simplify the administrative process in the ERASMUS+ program.

Exams

As a general rule, students can register for exams in their respective courses/study programs via a list available in the offices of the study program.

Credits

The Film University Babelsberg operates on the ECTS system. As a general rule, 1 ECTS equals 30h of workload. A full semester workload is 30 ECTS.

Health Insurance

In Germany, all students are subject to compulsory health insurance, regardless of whether they are degree seeking students or exchange students. A proof of adequate health insurance cover is essential and required for enrollment at university as well as for getting a residence permit.

Students from European Countries with a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) do not require additional health insurance. Students from countries that do not have any social security agreement with Germany need to be insured via a health insurance provider. Find more information on health insurance [here](#).

Visa

Students from EU member states do not require a visa for Germany. Please inform yourselves on the webpage of the [Federal Foreign Office](#) if you require a visa. It is highly recommended to apply for a visa much in advance.

Non-EU students already holding a residence permit for another EU country need to get in touch with International Office at Film University.

Erasmus+

The Film University Babelsberg takes part in the ERASMUS+ program of the EU. Incoming students can inquire at their home institution if they are eligible for funding by the program and should



apply for such at the International Office of their home institution.
